She has taught Suzuki violin in Greenville for 42 years, teaching all ages and levels from 3 year olds to adults, with 80 private students a week for 20 of the years. Joanne regularly speaks about the Suzuki Approach throughout the country and world, including Sweden, England, Australia and Italy.
